

Breakthrough In Womb Transplant



A pioneering new treatment means that women born without a uterus, or who had it removed because of a condition such as cancer, may still be able to have children. At least nine women in Sweden have now received new wombs, including one that was donated by a mother to her daughter. Dr Mats Brannstrom, one of the key medical experts behind the treatment, said that some of the transplant recipients experienced a menstrual
